Welcome Letter to New Rose Hill Residents

We are glad you chose Rose Hill – Phase I for your home and hope you are able to establish yourselves into the neighborhood as quickly and as easily as possible.

Here are a few items that you may find useful as you settle into your new home.

- Starting Utility Services

- Rose Hill Homeowner's Association

Rose Hill Phase I is a DEED-RESTRICTED neighborhood and has a mandatory and active Homeowner's Association. Every homeowner is automatically a member of the Association.

Dues are \$300 a year and are paid in 2 installments of \$150 each BY January 1st and July 1st of each year. On Jan 1st you MAY pay for the whole year if you would prefer.

Our Rose Hill Annual Homeowner's Association meeting is held at the West Oaks Mall Community Room on the third Saturday in February at 10:00 A.M.

A bulletin board is located on the corner of American Beauty Street and Rose Hill Drive next to the retention pond and has Association information posted on it. ARB forms are also available at the bulletin board.

Our neighborhood is not connected to any city or county sewage system. Each home has its own SEPTIC TANK and leach field usually buried somewhere in the front yard. Because we each have our own septic we do not pay fees for wastewater treatment. Septic tanks should be pumped out approximately every 3 to 5 years to maintain their healthy functioning. You should also ADD active bacteria to the tank about once a month to help keep it problem free for the long haul.

- Homestead and Other Tax Exemptions

If you qualify for a homestead exemption, you can reduce the taxable value of your homestead property resulting in a tax savings. You can file for a homestead exemption in

person, by mail or online. Applications must be filed by March 1st. There are other exemptions as well, but the Homestead Exemption is the one most commonly used.

- Orange County is one of seven counties in Central Florida and is a charter county with its own constitution. It is self-governed with Mayor Jerry Demings and six district commissioners. Our neighborhood lies within District 2 and is represented by Commissioner Christine Moore on the Board of County Commissioners.

- Orange County Solid Waste Division (orangecountyfl.net, Residents, Water Garbage & Recycling, 407-836-6601) has a curbside collection program that provides residents with roll carts to dispose of garbage (green lid) and recyclables (blue lid). <u>When not being used for trash or recyclable pick-up</u>, please keep the roll carts hidden from street view.

Hazardous household waste, such as paint, toxic chemicals or electronic items, can be disposed of at the Porter Transfer Station (check for day and time) located at 1326 Good Homes Road.

<u>Trash and recyclables are picked up on Monday. Large items such as furniture, mattresses, etc. and yard waste are picked up on Tuesday. Roll carts should be placed at the curb no earlier than 6:00 p.m. the night before and no later than 6:00 a.m. on the scheduled collection day.</u>

Recycling is required by Orange County Code. The top five recyclable items are: cardboard, paper, plastic #1-5 ONLY, metal cans, glass containers – NO plastic bags.

Yard waste includes vegetative landscaping material as well as grass, tree, and shrub trimmings, and should not be place in the garbage or recycling roll carts. Limit weekly yard waste to 3 cubic yards per week per household. Use your own garbage cans or plastic bags for yard waste. Cans or bags must be 50 gallons or less and weigh less than 60 pounds. Cans must be waterproof with a tight-fitting lid and have handles on the sides. Bundle limbs, palm fronds and similar items with string. Keep bundles 3 feet long or less. Limit weight to less than 60 pounds.

- Orange County and the St. John's River Water Management District impose watering restrictions for irrigating residential lawns. During Daylight Savings Time, March – November, odd-numbered addresses irrigate on Wednesdays and Saturdays and even-numbered addresses irrigate on Thursdays and Sundays before 10:00 a.m. or after 4:00 p.m. Irrigation is reduced to one day per week from November to March (Standard Time) on Saturdays for odd-numbered addresses and Sundays for even-numbered addresses. Please visit the Orange County Utilities website (orangecountyfl.net, Water, Garbage & Recycling, watering restrictions) or the St. John's River Water Management District website (<u>www.sjrwmd.com</u>) for details.

- In August of each year, the Orange County Property Appraiser sends a Truth in Millage (TRIM) notice to all property owners. Look for it in the mail. You will recognize it by prominent lettering, "DO NOT PAY – This is not a bill." The TRIM notice tells you the taxable value of your property and proposed millage rates and taxes as estimated by our community taxing authorities. It lists when and where these authorities will hold public meetings to discuss tentative budgets to set the millage tax rates. Fees not related to your property value, non-valorum assessments, also appear on your TRIM notice for trash collection, roads, lighting and other government services. These fees are set by the taxing authority and are not affected by any change in the value of your house or property.

- Pets: If you have lost a pet or would like to adopt a pet, Orange County Animal Services can help.
